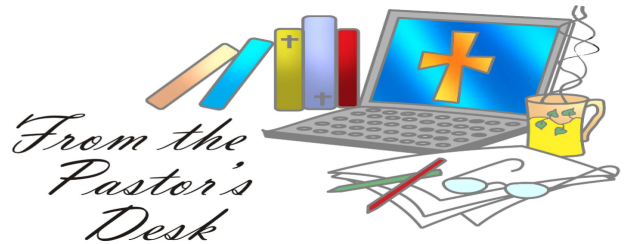

Someone who was interested in how much money John D. Rockefeller left behind was told "all of it." In the Gospel story, however, the rich man with the bountiful harvest is shown to be isolated, oblivious of both God and his fellow human beings. His soliloquy reveals his self-centeredness. Rather than consult those whose lives are intertwined with his, he asks himself, "What shall I do.... I do not have space.... I shall tear down.... I shall store.... I shall say to myself...." The focus of his reflection is "my harvest...my barns...my grain...myself. Francis de Sales wrote in his Introduction to the Devout Life: "There is a difference between *possessing* poison and *being* poisoned. Pharmacists keep almost every kind of poison in stock for use on various occasions, yet they are not themselves poisoned because it is merely in their shops, not in their bodies. So, too, you can possess riches without being poisoned by them if you keep them in your home, purse or wallet, but not in your heart." The man in the Gospel parable is not condemned because he had filled his *barn* with riches: he is condemned because he had allowed his *heart* to be consumed by *riches*. Unfortunately, in a world like ours, our personal value is often measured by the extent and quality of what we possess. We admire those who have money, power, and status. Unfortunately, none of these things is a true measure of the value of a person. Today, Paul exhorts us to put to death "immorality, impurity, passion, evil desires, and greed that is idolatry." He tells us to "stop lying to one another." I wonder how all the spin-doctors react to this challenge? Power and influence come and go. When we look closely at all that we achieve, we realize that real success is much more than money or power. May God open our minds and hearts to what is truly of value! God Bless you always!

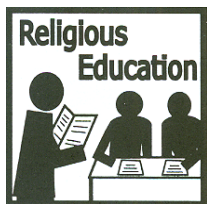
Family Mass and Parish Picnic 2010

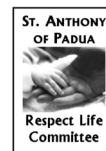
Catechists Needed
